### DESCRIPTION

- Levelmatic (automatic recording level adjuster-patent pending) with conventional tape recorders, when the input signal swings the pointer of the level indicator into the red level area, distortion increases suddenly. With Belsona Junior 500, however, because of Hitachi's unique levelmatic system, the recording level is automatically adjusted to a proper level even when there is an excessive input signal.
- Thus, recordings formerly resulting infailure because of the changing level can now be made very successfully and much more simply.
- Easy to operate "one-hand-control"
   Hitachi's own "one-hand-control" system used so successfully in Hitachi's Belsona 700 is also utilized in the Belsona Junior 500. A single knob controls recording, play back,

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- re-winding, erasing, fast forward, instant stop and level matching.
- 3. Reproduction with natural symphonic tone quality is possible.
  - Combination of the large speaker  $(6\frac{1}{2}"\times3")$  with power output of 1.5 W and front acoustical system reproduces well balanced and expanded sound with symphonic tone quality.
- 4. Suitcase type with carrying handle
   The band attached on the side makes transporting of
   Belsona Junior 500 very simple. A belt on the case bottom
   is convenient for holding tapes; the electric cord and
   microphone may be stored inside the upper cover.
- 5. Highly sensitive dynamic microphone The highly sensitive dynamic microphone with excellent high frequency characteristics easily captures even the faintest sounds. High accuracy recording head records the natural voice faithfully.
- 6. Trouble-free silicon rectifier circuit.

- Auxiliary cord to simplify recording from radio or television set.
- 8. Easy to read and long-lasting levelindicator.
- 9. The rigid construction and smooth rotation maintain the recorder's high accuracy for long time.




Fig. 1 Tape Storing Belt




Fig. 2 Block Diagram

### CONTROLS

### Function selector knob

"One Hand Control" system controls all the action: record, play back, erase, re-wind and fast forward. The center of the recording button (red) indicates positions.




Fig. 3 Front View





Fig. 4 Right Side View

POWER SUPPLY CORD




Fig. 6 Upper Lid

### Recording button (REC)

When recording, press this button while turning the operating knob to "Play".

### ON-OFF switch and volume control knob (VOLUME)

This turns the power on or off, adjusts the recording level and controls the reproduction volume.

### Microphone terminal (MIC)

This is the input terminal when recording with use of the microphone.

### Radio terminal (RADIO)

Input terminal for use when recording from radio, television set or record player.

### External speaker terminal (EXT SP)

This is an output terminal for connection to other speakers and amplifiers for reproduction. Its impedance is 8  $\Omega$ .

### Selecting tape speed

This is done by changing the capstan. When using at 4.75 mm/sec, remove the head cover and the capstan (turn the screw to the left). Hang the removed capstan collar on the collar hanger at the left of the erasing head.

### Storing accessories

The power cord (secured with clips) and microphone can be stored inside the upper cover. Tapes and empty reels can be placed in boxes and fastened to the bottom of the case.

### DISASSEMBLY INSTRUCTION

Dismantle the parts when checking or repairing acording to the procedure described below.

### (1) Removing the upper panel




Fig. 7 Panel Holding Screws

After removing the volume control and operating knobs, remove the four screws shown in Fig. 7 and lift off the




Fig. 8 Interior Mechanism

upper panel. Checking of the interior mechanism is possible in this condition. (Fig. 8)

### (2) Drawing out the chassis




Fig. 10 Chassis Interior




Fig. 9 Chassis Holding Screws

Remove the chassis holding screws which also act as rubber supports (Fig. 9) and pull out the chassis. (Fig. 10)

### (3) Removing printed circuit board




Fig. 11 Chassis Side




Fig. 12 Removing Printed Circuit Board

As shown in Fig. 11, remove the subchassis on which the jack plate and slide switch are mounted; remove two screws holding the board and (as shown in Fig. 12) remove the jack plate, slide switch and the printed circuit board

together as a unit.

### (4) Changing cycles (50 cycles -60 cycles)




Fig. 13 Cycle Changing

As shown in Fig. 13. remove the motor pulley, replace it with a 60-cycle pulley (located at the upper right of the chassis) and re-wire the motor to 60-cycle terminals.

### (5) Lubrication

Lubricate the mechanism of this tape recorder according to the table below and Fig. 14. The mechanism is lubricated sufficiently at the factory; take care not to lubricate too much.



1	Fitting parts of rewind reel stand and shaft	Spindle oil #60
2	Fitting parts of take-up reel rest and shaft	Spindle oil #60
3	Sliding parts of rewinding arm and plate spring lock	Grease
4	Sliding parts of switch press plate and sub- chassis washer	Grease
(5)	Pressure roller arm roller and pin roller which contact selector cam	Grease
6	Fitting parts of pressure roller arm and pressure arm shaft	Spindle oil #60
7	Sliding parts of moderating plate and subchassis	Grease
8	Fitting parts of flywheel shaft and metal	Turbine oil

Fig. 14 Lubrication Points


### (6) Precautions in handling


This set is constructed so that its interior is well ventilated to eliminate the effects of temperature rise. When using it on rugs or blankets, etc., the ventilation (for cooling) becomes poor and will cause malfunctions. Be sure not to obstruct the ventilation holes on the case bottom plate.
